

What is Kuchen



In 1997, what started out as a bake sale of goodies, including kuchen, to raise money for the Historical Society, the event turned into the annual kuchen festival. By 1998, about 100 kuchens were assembled by hand at the community building, and then taken to five or six homes to be baked. On the day of the sale, they sold out before noon. In 1999, the number of kuchens more than doubled to over 350 and 26 dozen eggs, 100 pounds of flour, 3 gallons of milk, 80 pints of cream and 55 pounds of sugar were used. In the year 2000, the kuchen baking was moved to the Tyndall bakery and almost 500 kuchens were prepared. All labor is volunteered during the kuchen making process.

The price for each kuchen started at \$5.00 each and now have increased to \$14.00 per kuchen. In 2024, 1200 kuchens were made and sold. The flavors include apple, peach, cherry, custard, rhubarb, poppy seed, cottage cheese, coconut, mulberry, blueberry, prune, and streusel. The Delmont Historical Society also prepared and served the South Dakota Legislature kuchen sometime in the early 2000's. It was enjoyed so much that the congressmen declared kuchen to be the state dessert.

In 2023, the alumni committee made the decision to move their gathering to the same weekend of the kuchen festival and the Old Iron Tractor Club celebration in September so all can enjoy. More pictures and history on the kuchen festival can be found in the old pump house museum for every one to read.
